Great news for you and your child! Your child is eligible to receive a healthy breakfast and lunch at school at <u>no</u> <u>charge</u> to your household each day of the 2023-24 school year. Your child will be able to participate in these meal programs without having to pay a fee or submit a meal application.

Your child is eligible for free meals at the school they are currently enrolled. Also, please note that this program does not take away any existing debt incurred over past school years, and it will be the parent/ guardian's responsibility to ensure that the debt be paid in full, or it could be sent to magistrate court.
