# New Administrative Guideline

Focusing on improving organizational effectiveness and efficiency the change brings in line the district's purchasing guidelines with the new state bidding minimums of \$10,000.

The recent change from WVDE brings their bidding requirements in line with federal changes.

To improve uniformity and to avoid unnecessary delays in purchasing, we are amending the purchasing guideline to reflect the state and federal changes.

In the future the Board will see those PO request over \$10,000, a change from the original \$5,000.

## Organizational Wellness

### 1. Communication

By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, improve communication with stakeholders (including parents, staff, and community members) by implementing a structured communication plan that includes board presentations, community group presentations, newspaper interviews, communication guidelines for school leaders, radio interviews, and meetings with key stakeholders.

The effectiveness of this communication will be measured by ensuring that at least 90% of the planned communication activities are executed as scheduled and by tracking the distribution of communication materials to ensure that at least 75% of targeted stakeholders have received and reviewed the information.

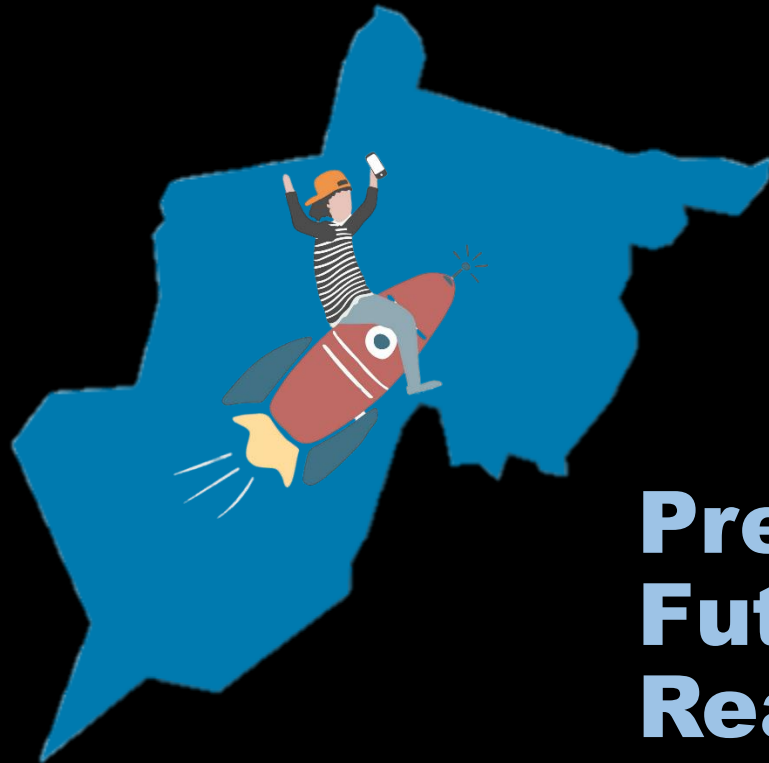

By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, establish three key initiatives to improve academic focus and prepare students for future readiness. These initiatives will include:

- 1) Defining non-negotiables for academic standards and expectations across all grades,
- 2) Establishing a centralized focus to align curriculum and teaching practices with future readiness goals, and
- 3) Developing and implementing a superintendent walk-through process to regularly assess and support the alignment of classroom practices with established standards.

Success will be measured by achieving 90% regularity in completing weekly walk-throughs and ensuring that 50% of classrooms display the established non-negotiables by the conclusion of the school year.
